> Monthly Call Volumes: Chief Turner reported that 29 calls were received in September.

> <u>Personnel Count</u>: Chief Turner reported that there are currently 11 active fire fighters, one on leave of absence, one on probationary status, and one intern from the military.

<u>District Vehicles</u>: Chief Turner reported that all vehicles are in service.

Deputy Chief: There was no report at this time.

Captain: There was no report at this time.

<u>President</u>: President Rolenc congratulated the firefighters on a job well done with the Birdseye Fire.

Vice President: Director Miller congratulated the firefighters on a job well done with the Birdseye Fire.

<u>Treasurer/Assistant Secretary</u>: Director Orness reported that he is still waiting on paperwork to be on the District's bank accounts.

Secretary: Director Turner commended the Chiefs and the Department on their bravery during the Birdseye Fire and their organizational skills in running the Incident Command.
